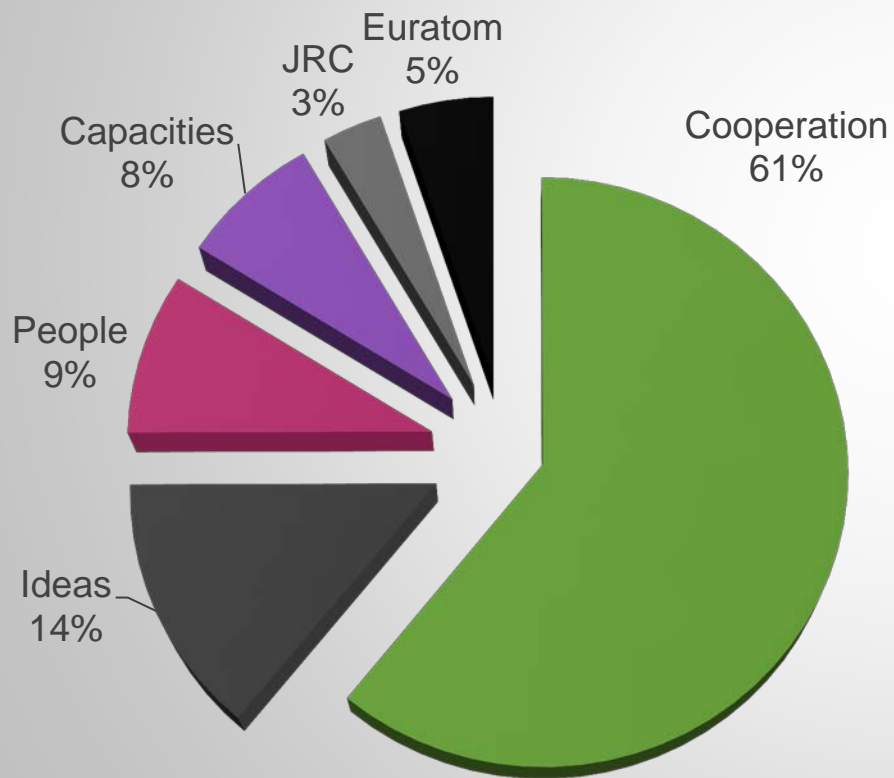

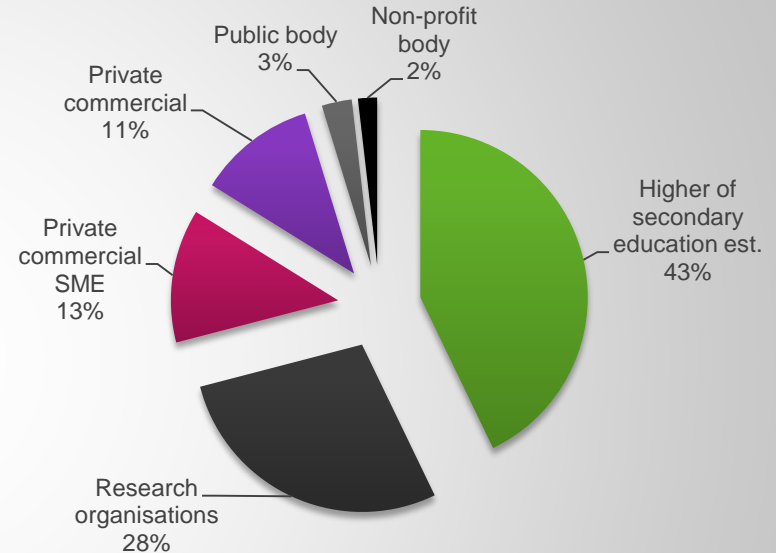

EU contribution for research and technological development

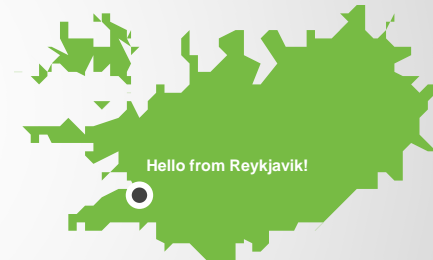

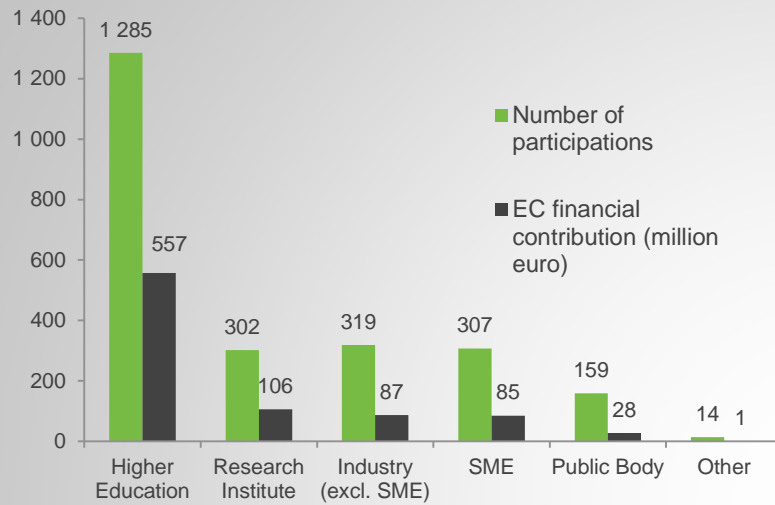

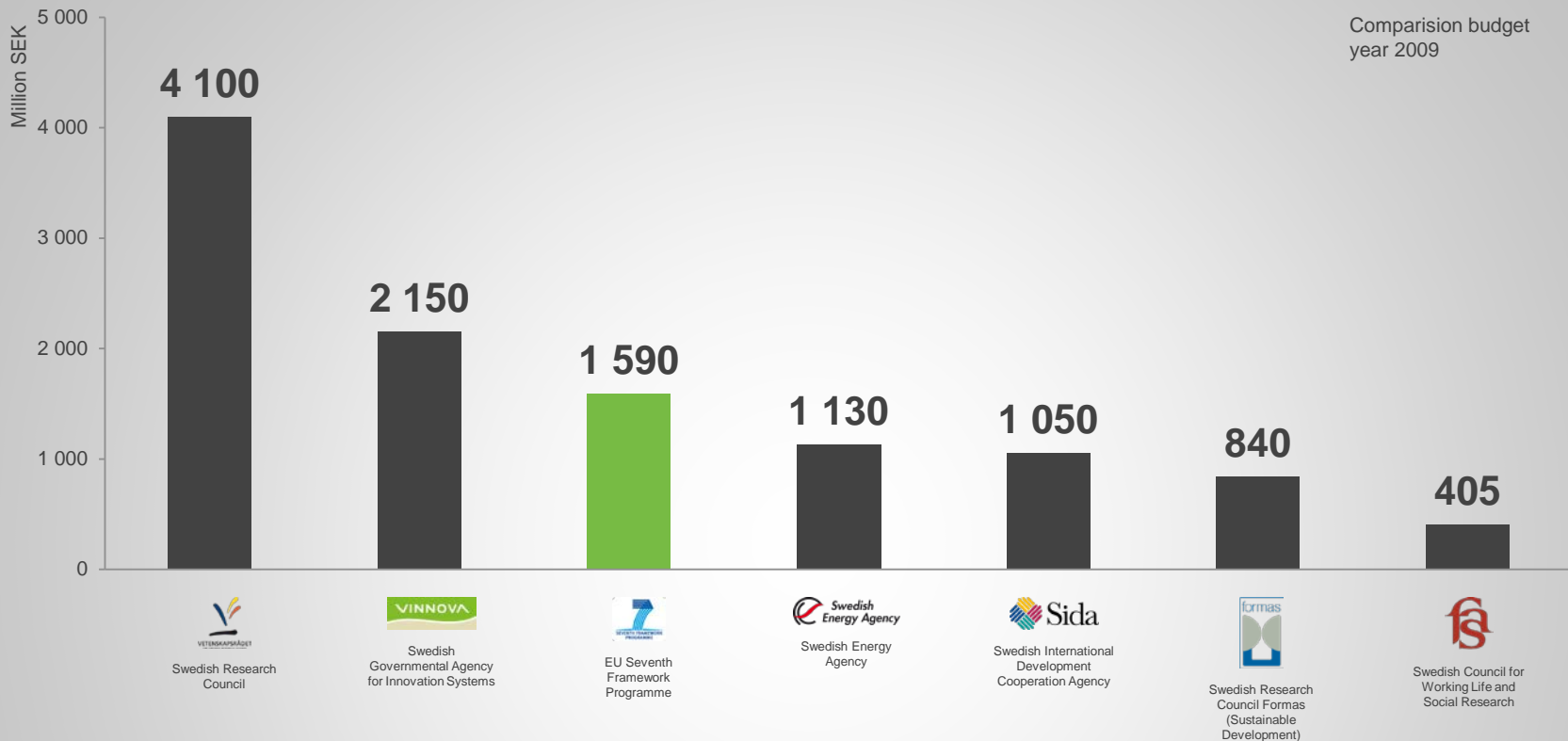
